

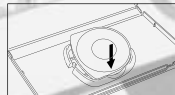

### Health precautions

- When operating the unit, play in a well-lit room and keep a safe distance from the screen.
- Avoid prolonged use of the console. Take a break of about 15 minutes during every hour of play.
- Do not use the console when you are tired or short of sleep.
- When using headphones, do not turn the volume up before putting the headphones on. Also, do not listen at loud volume levels for extended periods of time. Stop using the console immediately if you experience any of the following symptoms. If the condition persists, consult a doctor.
- Lightheadedness, nausea, or a sensation similar to motion sickness.
- Discomfort or pain in the eyes, ears, hands, arms, or any other part of the body.

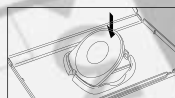
### Use and handling precautions

- This disc is PSP® (PlayStation®Portable) format software and is intended for use with the PSP system only. If the disc is used with other devices, damage to the disc or to the device may result.
- This disc is compatible for use with the PSP® system marked with FOR SALE AND USE IN U.S. ONLY.
- Depending on the software, a Memory Stick Duo™ or Memory Stick PRO Duo™ (both sold separately) may be required. Refer to the software manual for full details.
- Do not use while driving or walking. Do not use in airplanes or medical facilities where use is prohibited or restricted.
- Set the PSP® system's wireless network feature to off when using the PSP® system on trains or in other crowded locations. If used near persons with pacemakers, the signal from the PSP® system's wireless network feature could interfere with the proper operation of the pacemaker.
- If paused images are displayed on the screen for an extended period of time, a faint image may be left permanently on the screen.
- Store the disc in its case when not in use and keep in a place out of the reach of children. If the disc is left out this may result in warping or other damage to the disc.
- Do not leave the disc in direct sunlight, near a heat source, in a car or other places subject to high heat and humidity.
- Do not touch the opening on the rear of the disc (recording surface of the disc; see drawing). Also, do not allow dust, sand, foreign objects or other types of dirt to get on the disc.
- Do not block the opening with paper or tape. Also, do not write on the disc.
- If the opening area does get dirty, wipe gently with a soft cloth.
- To clean the disc, wipe the exterior surface gently with a soft cloth.
- Do not use solvents such as benzine, commercially-available cleaners not intended for CDs, or anti-static spray intended for vinyl LPs as these may damage the disc.
- Do not use cracked or deformed discs or discs that have been repaired with adhesives as these may cause console damage or malfunction.

#### Ejecting the disc

Press the right side of the disc until it is in the position shown in the drawing and then remove it. If excess force is applied this may result in damage to the disc.



#### Storing the disc

Insert the bottom side of the disc and then press on the top side until it clicks into place. If the disc is not stored properly, this may result in damage to the disc.

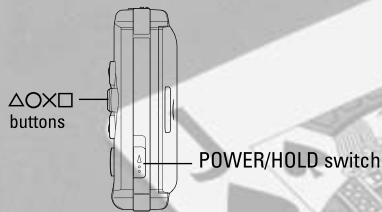

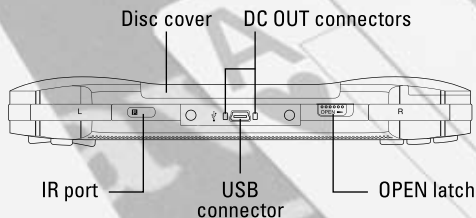

## GETTING STARTED

Set up your PSP® (PlayStation®Portable) system according to the instructions in the manual supplied with the system. Turn the system on. The power indicator lights up in green and the home menu is displayed. Press the OPEN latch to open the disc cover. INSERT Hard Rock Casino disc with the label facing away from the system, slide until fully inserted and close the disc cover. From the PSP® system's home menu, select the Game icon and then the UMD icon. A thumbnail for the software is displayed. Select the thumbnail and press the button of the PSP® to start the software. Follow the on-screen instructions and refer to this manual for information on using the software.

**NOTICE:** Do not eject a UMD™ while it is playing.

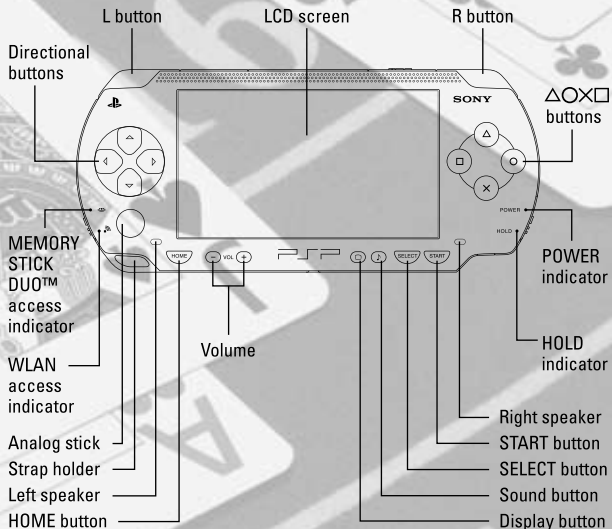
### Memory Stick Duo™

## INTRODUCTION

**Hard Rock Casino** captures the excitement and spectacle of becoming a swingin' High Roller in the world's most exciting casino, The Hard Rock. You can try your luck at over 20 different casino games, as well as experiencing high stake areas, invitation only tournaments, and many unlockable upgrades for your highly customizable character. The action spans across multiple casino environments filled with different themes and characters. All of the casinos and games are presented in true 3D with multiple camera angles showing off the gaming floor as well as presenting the action in a television broadcast style.

### **Adventure Mode:**

Adventure Mode begins by having you create a character which you will control throughout the game. Once this is done, you'll begin the game in the lobby of the Hard Rock Casino. Use the directional buttons to move to the different rooms. There are rooms for Poker Games, Table Games, Slots, and Sports Book betting. Inside each of the rooms are a number of games to play. Use the directional buttons to move to the different games in each room and select one with the **X** button. As you play different games, you are presented with a series of goals and challenges that you must complete to advance through the Casino Adventure!

### **Quick Play:**

Quick Play randomly generates a character for you to play as and allows you to select any of the unlocked casinos to play in. You can play any of the casino games for fun or for practice.

### **Tutorials:**

Instructions on how to play all of the games in Hard Rock Casino can be viewed by selecting the Tutorials option from the Main Menu.

## HOW TO PLAY

There is a lot of information to consider when playing Hard Rock Casino. For all table and poker games (except for Craps and Roulette), a list of the players at the table is displayed along the left side of the screen. As they make plays or reveal their cards, this list will update to reflect their actions. For all games, your bankroll is displayed in the lower center of the screen. Your cards are always displayed just above your bankroll. If there are dealer cards or community cards, they are always displayed in the upper right side of the screen. Player options for making bets and plays are always located on the Poker Chip graphic, located in the lower right side of the screen.

### **Making a Bet:**

When it's your turn to bet, a poker chip graphic is displayed in the lower right of the screen. Bets are placed by pressing up, down, left or right using the directional buttons to adjust the bet amount and then pressing the **X** button to confirm. For games where you place bets on the table, such as Roulette, use the Analog stick to highlight the location you want to place a bet. Once a bet location is highlighted, use the directional buttons to adjust the bet amount and press the **X** button to confirm.

### **Making a Play:**

Each game has specific selectable options (such as "Hit" and "Stand" in Black Jack) which change based on the state of the game. These selectable options are displayed on the Poker Chip graphic located in the lower right of the screen. Selections are made by pressing and holding the appropriate direction using the directional buttons and then pressing the **X** button to confirm. If you move to a selectable option and decide not to select it, simply release the directional buttons to center the highlighter.

### **Saving and Loading:**

You can save your game at any time by going to your hotel room. Your hotel room can be accessed from the Lobby at all of the Casinos. You can load a save game at any time by accessing the Load option from the Main Menu.

### **OPTIONS MENU** (MAIN MENU AND IN-GAME)

The Options Menu can be accessed from the Main Menu. From in-game, you can access the Options Menu by pressing the Start button. This gives the following list:

#### **Gameplay:**

This option allows you to adjust Gameplay settings

#### **Sound:**

This option allows independent control of the volume of the music and sound effects. Use directional buttons on the sliding bars to change the volume.

#### **Credits:**

View the game credits.

### **MULTI-PLAYER**

#### **Ad-Hoc Mode:**

Hard Rock Casino supports Ad Hoc Mode, which is a Wi-Fi feature that allows two or more PSP systems to communicate with each other. Up to four players can compete in a "Race to 10K" mode (with the exception of Heads Up Hold'em). Games available for wireless multi-player are Texas Hold'em, Let it Ride, Black Jack and the PSP system exclusive slot machines (Surf's Up and Space Race).

### **Game Sharing:**

By using the PSP system's ability to share gaming experiences across consoles via the Game Sharing feature, Hard Rock Casino allows you to share casino games with other players who own PSP systems but do not own the game. The following games are shared:

- Black Jack
- Let It Ride
- Big Raise Hold'em
- Casino War
- Pai Gow Poker

### **POKER HAND RANKINGS**

#### **Royal Flush**

This is the best possible poker hand. Ten, Jack, Queen, King and Ace all of the same suit.

#### **Straight Flush**

Five cards of the same suit in sequence.

#### **4 of a Kind**

Four cards of the same rank, such as four Kings.

#### **Full House**

Three cards of one rank and two cards of another rank. For example, three Jacks and two Tens.

#### **Flush**

Five cards of the same suit.

#### **Straight**

Five consecutive cards of mixed suits.

#### **Three of a Kind**

Three cards of the same rank.

#### **Two Pair**

Two cards of one rank and two cards of another rank.

#### **One Pair**

Two cards of the same rank.

### Updating the PSP® system software

This UMD™ includes the latest update data for the PSP® system. If a screen prompting you to update the system software is displayed when you start the UMD™, you must perform an update to start the software title contained on the UMD™.

### Performing the update

When you insert the UMD™, an icon (as shown on the right) is displayed under [Game] in the home menu. Select the icon, and then follow the on-screen instructions to perform the update.

Before starting the update:

- Fully charge the PSP® system battery.
- Connect the AC adaptor to the system and plug it into an electrical outlet.

During an update:

- Do not remove the AC adaptor, turn off the system or remove the UMD™.

If an update is canceled before completion, the system software may become damaged, and the system may require servicing to repair or exchange.

### Checking that the update was successful

After the update has been completed, select [System Settings] under [Settings] from the home menu, and then select [System Information]. If the System Software field displays the version number of the update, the update was successful.
